already has a SNET cellular tower located off Oakdale Avenue which many believe was based on a misleading application which included photographs of a tower which did not extend beyond the tree tops. The tower eventually constructed is over 100 feet above the tree tops.

After notifying the Attorney General of Connecticut, this office was notified that the AG and the Connecticut Siting Council submitted a joint statement opposing the petition. The Winchester Planning and Zoning Commission unanimously adopted a resolution in opposition to the petition at its February 14, 1995 meeting, and the Board of Selectmen unanimously voted to oppose the petition at its February 21, 1995 meeting.

The deadline for public comment has been extended. Citizens can write to the Federal Communications Commission Room 222, 1919 M Street NW, Washington, D.C. 20554. Include the petition reference number RM-8577 and let the FCC know you do not want the cellular telecommunications industry to build towers wherever it wants without state or local intervention.

Also Contact Senator Dodd (800-334-5341), Senator Lieberman (800-225-5605) and Representative Johnson (203-723-8412) and let them know you do not want Congress to adopt legislation that would preempt state and local law.
